Samaritan Team Ensures a Veteran's Final Farewell to His Beloved Wife

The love birds held hands across their hospital beds, positioned close together in the living room as they slept.

Emilio and Ana M. Serrano had walked through life hand in hand for 72 years, through raising five beautiful children – three daughters and two sons – and through Emilio's two tours in Vietnam and one in Korea. They even received Samaritan hospice care together.

After Ana passed, the question became how to transport Emilio, who was physically fragile and bed bound, so that he could say goodbye to his beloved wife at her service.

The Challenge: Finding The Right Transportation

The Serrano daughters, Ana E., Carmen, and Milagros, had been caregivers for their parents for seven years and were used to doing everything themselves. Together they had navigated the needs of their mom's dementia and their father's lung disease, and they were amazed by their parents' Samaritan hospice care team and the amount of support which the team provided them.

"You guys were always a step ahead, realizing what the challenges were going to be."

The Road to The Service

When Ana called Serena, their Samaritan hospice social worker, to see if transport support was possible and if Samaritan could provide Emilio portable oxygen for the services that Friday, Serena's answer was instant. "How can we help?"

While Samaritan could provide the oxygen, they did not have transportation vehicles, yet Serena promised the team would do everything they could to help Emilio and the family. They immediately got to work, researching options, making phone calls, and sending emails.

suggested the team reach out to Senator Troy Singleton's office, the team found their answer. The Senator's office suggested that SEN-HAN might be able to transport Emilio and immediately reached out to see if it would be possible. Shortly after, SEN-HAN confirmed they would transport Emilio to the service, the viewing, and then back home at no charge to the family.

A Hospice Miracle

"We just couldn't believe someone was helping us," Ana said. For the family, their dad missing his wife's services was unthinkable. Having support to transport their dad allowed them to focus on saying goodbye to mom.

On the day of his wife's service, SEN-HAN arrived with an accessible vehicle to drive Emilio to the service. Although Emilio is a stoic man, his relief at being able to say goodbye to his wife, was evident.

Advice For Other Caregivers: More Help Than You Realize


With a heart full of thanks, daughter Ana heaped praise on everyone involved. "I would like to wholeheartedly thank them for everything that they have done for my father."


